

If someone asks you 'What's that?' or 'Who's this?', the word you answer with is usually a noun:

- It's an elephant.
- It's a house.
- It's a forest.
- It's Paul.

The underlined words are *nouns*.

Nouns are words that mean people or things.

Here are some words that aren't nouns:

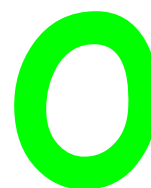
- tall (a thing can be tall, but 'tall' itself isn't a thing)
- slowly (there's no such thing as 'a slowly')
- and

In Esperanto it's easy to spot the nouns, because they have an **o** flag at the end.

Remember!

The **o** is a little flag that says:

Hi!  
I am a noun!
